Explanations

1. “many” (d)

Use 'many' before countable plural nouns. 'Friends' is countable. The context says 'Everyone likes her', so she has a large number of friends.

2. “little” (a)

Use 'little' before uncountable nouns. 'Time' is uncountable, so we need 'little'.

3. “few” (c)

Use 'few' before countable plural nouns. 'Eggs' is countable, so we need 'few'.

4. “little” (b)

Use 'little' before uncountable nouns. 'Patience' is uncountable. The context says 'often loses her temper', confirming she has very little patience.

5. “few” (c)

Use 'few' before countable plural nouns. 'Friends' is countable, so we need 'few'.

6. “little” (a)

Use 'little' before uncountable nouns. 'Milk' is uncountable, so we need 'little'.
