Explanations

1. “by” (c)

Use 'by' to introduce the agent (the person who does the action) in passive sentences. 'By Charles Dickens' tells us who wrote the novel.

2. “No 'by' phrase is needed.” (c)

When the agent is unknown or unimportant, we simply omit the 'by' phrase. 'The car was washed' is a complete sentence.

3. “by” (b)

Use 'by' before the agent. Picasso is an important, specific agent — we want to say who painted it.

4. “My wallet was stolen.” (b)

When the agent is unknown or vague (someone, people, somebody), we usually omit the 'by' phrase. 'My wallet was stolen' is more natural.

5. “by” (b)

Use 'by' when the agent is the cause or thing that performed the action. The ball caused the window to break.

6. “with” (a)

Use 'with' for the instrument or tool used to do something. Use 'by' for the agent (person/thing that does the action). The pen is the tool, not the agent.

7. “by” (c)

Use 'by' to introduce who performs the action. Here, 'millions of people' is the agent who speaks English.

8. “with” (a)

Use 'with' for ingredients you can see or taste in the final product. Compare: 'made from' is used when the original material is completely transformed (e.g., wine is made from grapes). Here the vegetables are visible in the soup, so 'with' is correct.

9. “No 'by' phrase is needed.” (b)

When the agent is obvious from context (police arrest criminals, doctors treat patients), we often omit the 'by' phrase.

10. “by” (a)

'By hand' is a fixed expression meaning 'manually, without machines'. Here 'by' indicates the method/manner, not a person. Other common expressions: by post, by email, by mistake.

11. “Rice is grown in many countries.” (b)

'Rice is grown in many countries' is correct because 'by farmers' is obvious and unnecessary. The other options have obvious agents that should be omitted.

12. “by” (b)

Use 'by' when the agent is a force or cause (fire, earthquake, flood). The fire caused the destruction.

13. “by” (b)

Use 'by' to introduce a specific, important agent. We include 'by J.K. Rowling' because the author is significant information.

14. “with” (a)

Use 'with' for the material or tool used. Icing is the material used to decorate, not the agent performing the action.

15. “No 'by' phrase is needed.” (b)

It's obvious that city workers/cleaners clean the streets. We omit the 'by' phrase when the agent is predictable.

16. “by” (d)

'By express post' indicates the method of delivery. 'By' is used for means of transport or communication: by post, by email, by car, by air.

17. “The theory of relativity was developed by Einstein.” (d)

We include 'by Einstein' because the agent is important and specific. The other sentences have obvious or unimportant agents.

18. “with” (d)

Use 'with' for the instrument or tool. A key is the tool used to open the door, not the person/agent.

19. “by” (d)

Use 'by' for natural forces and causes (rain, wind, earthquake). Heavy rain is the cause/agent of the flooding.

20. “The homework was corrected. (no 'by' phrase)” (a)

Since it's obvious that a teacher corrects homework, the 'by' phrase is unnecessary. Omitting it makes the sentence cleaner and more natural.
