Explanations

1. “at” (b)

Use 'at' with specific clock times: at 10 a.m., at 3:30, at noon.

2. “in” (a)

Use 'in' with towns, cities, villages and countries: in a village, in London, in France.

3. “in” (d)

Use 'in' with seasons: in winter, in spring, in summer, in autumn.

4. “on” (b)

Use 'on' for surfaces: on the roof, on the floor, on the table.

5. “at” (c)

Use 'at' for specific points or locations: at the bus stop, at the station, at the door.

6. “on” (a)

Use 'on' with specific dates: on 15th April, on 3rd March, on 25th December.

7. “on” (d)

Use 'on' for things attached to a surface: on the wall, on the ceiling, on the door.

8. “in” (b)

Use 'in' for enclosed or defined areas: in the garden, in the park, in the room.

9. “on” (c)

Use 'on' with days of the week, even when combined with a time of day: on Tuesday afternoon, on Monday morning.

10. “in” (d)

Use 'in' with years: in 1998, in 2024, in 1800.

11. “at” (b)

Use 'at' with noon and midnight: at noon, at midnight.

12. “on” (a)

Use 'on' when something rests on a surface: on the table, on the desk, on the shelf.

13. “at” (c)

Use 'at' with arrival points: arrive at the airport, at the station, at the hotel.

14. “in” (c)

Use 'in' with seasons: in spring, in summer, in autumn, in winter.

15. “on” (d)

Use 'on' for flat surfaces: on the floor, on the ground, on the carpet.

16. “at” (a)

Use 'at' with specific clock times: at 8 o'clock, at 9:15, at half past seven.

17. “in” (d)

Use 'in' for things inside a container or enclosed space: in the fridge, in the box, in the cupboard.

18. “on” (b)

Use 'on' with specific named days: on Christmas Day, on New Year's Day, on Easter Sunday. Note: 'at Christmas' refers to the Christmas period in general.

19. “on” (a)

Use 'on' for objects resting on a surface: on the shelf, on the table, on the desk.

20. “in” (c)

Use 'in' with months: in June, in March, in September.
