Explanations

1. “at” (d)

Use 'at' with specific clock times: at 9 o'clock, at 3:30, at half past two.

2. “in” (b)

Use 'in' with months: in March, in July, in December.

3. “on” (a)

Use 'on' with days of the week: on Friday, on Monday, on Wednesday.

4. “in” (d)

Use 'in' with years: in 1995, in 2024, in 1800.

5. “at” (a)

Use 'at' with specific times of day: at 7 a.m., at noon, at 6:15 p.m.

6. “on” (b)

Use 'on' with specific dates: on 21st June, on 3rd April, on 15th January.

7. “in” (d)

Use 'in' with seasons: in autumn, in spring, in summer, in winter.

8. “at” (b)

Use 'at' with noon and midnight: at noon, at midnight.

9. “on” (d)

Use 'on' with days of the week, including plural forms: on Saturdays (= every Saturday).

10. “in” (c)

Use 'in' with parts of the day: in the morning, in the afternoon, in the evening.

11. “at” (a)

Use 'at' with precise clock times: at 3:30, at 10:15, at quarter past five.

12. “in” (a)

Use 'in' with seasons: in spring, in summer, in autumn, in winter.

13. “on” (b)

Use 'on' with specific dates: on 14th February, on 25th December.

14. “in” (c)

Use 'in' with parts of the day: in the morning, in the afternoon, in the evening.

15. “in” (b)

Use 'in' with years: in 2018, in 2001, in 1990.

16. “at” (c)

Use 'at' with specific clock times, including 'half past' and 'quarter to': at half past seven.

17. “on” (d)

Use 'on' when a specific date is given, even with the month: on September 5th, on July 22nd.

18. “in” (a)

Use 'in' with seasons: in winter, in summer, in autumn, in spring.

19. “at” (c)

Use 'at' with specific clock times: at 6 o'clock, at 5:45.

20. “on” (c)

Use 'on' with days of the week: on Wednesday, on Thursday, on Sunday.
