Explanations

1. “them” (d)

'The books' is plural. After the verb 'bring', we need the object pronoun 'them', not the subject pronoun 'they'.

2. “her” (a)

'Lucy' is female and singular. After the verb 'see', we need the object pronoun 'her', not the subject pronoun 'she'.

3. “him” (c)

'My brother' is male and singular. After the verb 'call', we use the object pronoun 'him'.

4. “it” (b)

'This song' is singular and a thing. After the verb 'like', we use the object pronoun 'it'.

5. “them” (a)

'The children' is plural. After the verb 'feed', we use the object pronoun 'them', not the subject pronoun 'they'.

6. “it” (d)

'This word' is singular and a thing. After the verb 'explain', we use the object pronoun 'it'.

7. “her” (b)

'Sarah' is female. After the verb 'likes', we use the object pronoun 'her'. We cannot say 'likes she'.

8. “it” (c)

'My favourite film' is singular and a thing. After the verb 'watch', we use the object pronoun 'it'.

9. “her” (c)

'Amy' is female. After the verb 'visit', we use the object pronoun 'her', not the subject pronoun 'she'.

10. “him” (b)

'Mr. Brown' is male. After the verb 'respect', we use the object pronoun 'him'. We cannot say 'respect he'.

11. “them” (a)

'My grandparents' is plural. After the verb 'meet', we use the object pronoun 'them'.

12. “me” (d)

After 'let', we use an object pronoun. 'Let me help' is the correct form, not 'let I help'.

13. “us” (b)

After the verb 'asked', we need an object pronoun. 'Us' is the object form of 'we'. We cannot say 'asked we'.

14. “it” (c)

'A cake' is singular and a thing. After the verb 'try', we use the object pronoun 'it'.

15. “She” (d)

Here the blank is the subject of 'takes', so we need the subject pronoun 'she'. The object pronoun 'her' cannot be used as a subject.

16. “They” (a)

The blank is the subject of the verb 'walk', so we need the subject pronoun 'they', not the object pronoun 'them'.

17. “I” (d)

The blank is the subject of 'will reply', so we need the subject pronoun 'I'. 'Me' is the object form and cannot be used as a subject.

18. “It” (a)

The blank is the subject of 'is sleeping', so we need the subject pronoun 'it'. Object pronouns like 'him' or 'them' cannot be used as subjects.

19. “He” (b)

The blank is the subject of 'makes', so we need the subject pronoun 'he'. 'Him' is the object form and cannot be used here.

20. “me” (c)

After the verb 'help', we need an object pronoun. 'Me' is the object form of 'I'. We cannot say 'help I'.
