Explanations

1. “me” (a)

After the verb 'help', we need the object pronoun 'me' (not the subject pronoun 'I').

2. “him” (b)

After the preposition 'to', we use the object pronoun 'him' for a male person.

3. “them” (a)

'These flowers' is plural, so we use the object pronoun 'them' after the verb 'bought'.

4. “her” (d)

'Sarah' is female, so we use the object pronoun 'her' after the verb 'call'.

5. “us” (a)

The speaker is part of a group. After the verb 'show', we use the object pronoun 'us'.

6. “it” (d)

'This song' is singular and a thing, so we use the object pronoun 'it' after 'listen to'.

7. “them” (a)

'My parents' is plural, so we use the object pronoun 'them' after the verb 'love'.

8. “me” (b)

After the preposition 'next to', we use the object pronoun 'me'.

9. “him” (d)

'David' is male and singular. After the verb 'likes', we use the object pronoun 'him'.

10. “it” (a)

'The homework' is singular and uncountable, so we use 'it' after the verb 'finish'.

11. “her” (c)

'My sister' is female. After the preposition 'at', we use the object pronoun 'her'.

12. “us” (d)

The speaker is part of a group asking for water. After 'bring', we use 'us'.

13. “me” (d)

After the preposition 'with', we use the object pronoun 'me'.

14. “her” (b)

'Mrs. Parker' is female (Mrs. = a married woman). After 'listen to', we use the object pronoun 'her'.

15. “them” (b)

'Anna and Ben' are two people. After the verb 'let', we use the object pronoun 'them'.

16. “you” (c)

After the preposition 'for', we use the object pronoun 'you'. (Note: 'you' is the same in subject and object form.)

17. “it” (c)

'This word' is singular, so we use 'it' after the verb 'explain'.

18. “him” (c)

'My brother' is male. After the verb 'told', we use the object pronoun 'him'.

19. “them” (c)

After the preposition 'from', we use the object pronoun 'them' to refer to 'the neighbours'.

20. “her” (d)

'My grandmother' is female. After the verb 'visit', we use the object pronoun 'her'.
