Explanations

1. “She” (b)

The pronoun is the subject of the verb 'gave', so we use the subject form 'she' (not 'her').

2. “him” (b)

After the verb 'praised', we need an object pronoun. 'Him' is the object form of 'he'.

3. “She” (d)

The pronoun is the subject of the verb 'was buying', so we use the subject form 'she'.

4. “me” (a)

After 'pass' we need an object pronoun — the person receiving something. 'Me' is the object form of 'I'.

5. “I” (c)

'Mark and I' is the subject of the verb 'are going'. Use the subject form 'I' (not 'me').

6. “me” (b)

After the preposition 'to', we use the object form 'me'. 'Spoke to my colleague and me' — remove 'my colleague and' to check: 'spoke to me' (correct).

7. “they” (a)

The pronoun is the subject of the verb 'want', so we use the subject form 'they'.

8. “them” (d)

After the verb 'met', we need an object pronoun. 'Them' is the object form of 'they'.

9. “He” (a)

The pronoun is the subject of the verb 'told', so we use the subject form 'he'.

10. “her” (b)

After the verb 'invited', we need an object pronoun. 'Her' is the object form of 'she'.

11. “I” (b)

'My sisters and I' is the subject of 'went', so we use the subject form 'I'. Tip: remove 'my sisters and' — 'I went shopping' is correct.

12. “me” (d)

'You and me' is the object of 'wants to see'. Use the object form 'me'. Check: 'wants to see me' (correct).

13. “They” (a)

The pronoun is the subject of the verb 'are', so we use the subject form 'they'.

14. “him” (b)

After the verb 'trust', we need an object pronoun. The second sentence says 'he', so the object form is 'him'.

15. “We” (a)

The pronoun is the subject of 'need', so we use the subject form 'we' (not 'us').

16. “us” (d)

After the preposition 'of', we use the object form 'us'.

17. “She” (c)

The pronoun is the subject of 'spends', replacing 'Kate' (female). Use the subject form 'she'.

18. “it” (c)

After the verb 'hear', we need an object pronoun. 'It' refers to the knocking sound.

19. “her” (c)

After the preposition 'to', we use the object form 'her'. The sentence also confirms 'her' with 'gave her'.

20. “They” (c)

The pronoun is the subject of 'forget'. 'Their' later in the sentence confirms the plural subject — use 'they'.
