Explanations

1. “hasn't she” (b)

'Has finished' is present perfect (positive). The auxiliary is 'has', so the tag is 'hasn't she'.

2. “have they” (a)

'Haven't been' is negative present perfect. Negative → positive tag: 'have they'.

3. “won't it” (c)

'Will be' is positive future. Positive → negative tag: 'won't it'. The negative of 'will' is 'won't'.

4. “will you” (d)

'Won't forget' is negative future. Negative → positive tag: 'will you'.

5. “hadn't he” (b)

'Had left' is past perfect (positive). The auxiliary is 'had', so the tag is 'hadn't he'.

6. “haven't we” (a)

'Have met' is present perfect (positive). Positive → negative tag: 'haven't we'.

7. “isn't she” (c)

'Is going to' uses 'is' as the auxiliary. Positive → negative tag: 'isn't she'. With 'be going to', the tag uses the 'be' verb.

8. “will they” (b)

'Won't be' is negative future. Negative → positive tag: 'will they'.

9. “have you” (a)

'Haven't seen' is negative present perfect. Negative → positive tag: 'have you'.

10. “won't it” (c)

'Will arrive' is positive future. Positive → negative tag: 'won't it'.

11. “had they” (b)

'Hadn't finished' is negative past perfect. Negative → positive tag: 'had they'.

12. “hasn't he” (a)

'Has been working' is present perfect continuous (positive). The auxiliary is 'has', so the tag is 'hasn't he'.

13. “are we” (a)

'Aren't going to' uses 'aren't' (negative). Negative → positive tag: 'are we'. With 'be going to', the tag uses the 'be' verb.

14. “won't she” (d)

'Will help' is positive future. Positive → negative tag: 'won't she'.

15. “haven't you” (c)

'Have eaten' is present perfect (positive). Positive → negative tag: 'haven't you'.

16. “has he” (d)

'Hasn't replied' is negative present perfect. Negative → positive tag: 'has he'.

17. “aren't they” (b)

'Are going to' uses 'are' (positive). Positive → negative tag: 'aren't they'.

18. “had he” (d)

'Had never visited' contains 'never', which makes the statement negative. Negative → positive tag: 'had he'.
Words like 'never' count as negative.

19. “won't you” (c)

'Will be' is positive future. Positive → negative tag: 'won't you'.

20. “hasn't she” (d)

'Has got' uses 'has' as the auxiliary (positive). Positive → negative tag: 'hasn't she'. In British English, 'have got' uses 'have/has' for tags.
