Explanations

1. “was” (c)

'Cheese' is uncountable, so we use 'was'. The clause 'we ate it all' confirms it's past tense.

2. “weren't” (c)

'Films' is plural, so the negative form is 'weren't'. There weren't any good films at the cinema last week.

3. “It” (b)

We use 'It' with weather expressions: 'It was raining', 'It was cold', etc. 'There was' doesn't work with weather verbs. It was raining all day yesterday.

4. “was” (b)

'Snow' is uncountable, so we use 'was' even with 'a lot of'. There was a lot of snow last winter.

5. “are” (d)

'Now' and 'it's' tell us this is present tense. 'Many tourists' is plural, so we use 'are'.

6. “It” (a)

We use 'It was + adjective + to do something' to describe difficulty. 'There was' doesn't fit this pattern.

7. “weren't” (c)

'Students' is plural, so we need 'weren't'. There weren't any students absent from class yesterday.

8. “was” (d)

'Food' is uncountable, so we use 'was'. There was a lot of food at the party.

9. “isn't” (c)

'Now' tells us this is present tense. 'Time' is uncountable, so we use 'isn't'. There isn't much time left.

10. “It ... was” (a)

We say 'It was my birthday' (specific identification) and 'there was a party' (existence). It was my birthday, and there was a surprise party for me!

11. “were” (c)

'Letters' is plural, so we use 'were'. There were some letters on your desk when I came in.

12. “wasn't” (b)

'Noise' is uncountable, so we use 'wasn't'. 'It was very quiet' confirms the negative. There wasn't much noise in the library.

13. “were” (d)

'A few mistakes' is plural (a few + plural noun), so we use 'were'. 'Yesterday's report' confirms past tense. There were a few mistakes in yesterday's report.

14. “It” (b)

We use 'It was' to tell the time: 'It was ten o'clock', 'It is half past three', etc. 'There was' doesn't work for telling time.

15. “wasn't” (d)

'Coffee' is uncountable, so we use 'wasn't'. There wasn't any coffee left this morning.

16. “were” (b)

'Several reasons' is plural, so we use 'were'. There were several reasons for the delay.

17. “is ... wasn't” (a)

'Now' needs present tense 'is'; 'ten years ago' needs past tense negative 'wasn't'. A hospital is singular.

18. “was” (d)

'Milk' is uncountable, so we use 'was'. 'A little' goes with uncountable nouns. 'It wasn't enough' confirms past tense.

19. “weren't ... is” (a)

'Shops' is plural, so we need 'weren't' for the past. 'Now' signals present tense, and 'a shopping centre' is singular, so we use 'is'.

20. “It ... was” (a)

We use 'It was getting late' to talk about time (not 'There was'). 'Work' is uncountable, so we use 'was'. It was getting late. There was still a lot of work to do.
