Explanations

1. “are” (d)

Present continuous tense: Where are you going? Use 'are' + verb-ing for actions happening now.

2. “did” (a)

Past simple tense: What did she buy? Use 'did' + base verb for past simple questions.

3. “have” (d)

Present perfect tense: How long have you lived...? Use 'have/has' + past participle for present perfect questions.

4. “will” (c)

Future with 'will': Where will they travel? Use 'will' + base verb for future questions.

5. “were” (b)

Past continuous tense: What were the children doing? Use 'were' + verb-ing for actions in progress at a past moment.

6. “have” (c)

Present perfect continuous: Who have you been talking to? Use 'have' + been + verb-ing.

7. “did” (a)

Past simple: Why did he leave? Use 'did' + base verb for past simple questions.

8. “are” (d)

Future with 'be going to': What are you going to do? Use 'are' + going to + base verb for planned future actions.

9. “is” (b)

Present continuous: Where is she working? Use 'is' + verb-ing for current temporary situations.

10. “have” (b)

Present perfect: How many countries have you visited? 'So far' signals present perfect tense.

11. “did” (d)

Past simple: When did the package arrive? The answer 'It came yesterday' confirms past simple.

12. “are” (b)

Present continuous: What are you reading? 'At the moment' signals present continuous.

13. “will” (d)

Future with 'will': Where will the concert take place? 'Next Friday' signals future tense. Use 'will' + base verb.

14. “were” (c)

Past continuous: Why were you crying? 'When I saw you' sets a past moment; the action was in progress.

15. “does” (a)

Present simple: How does she get to school? 'Every day' signals a routine — present simple tense.

16. “has” (c)

Present perfect: What has happened? This asks about a change from the past to now — present perfect is appropriate.

17. “were” (b)

Past continuous: Where were you working? 'Before you joined' sets a past time frame; the working was ongoing.

18. “is” (a)

Future with 'be going to': When is the film going to start? Use 'is' + going to for planned/scheduled events.

19. “have” (c)

Present perfect: How long have they known each other? Asking about duration from past to present uses present perfect.

20. “do” (a)

Present simple: What do you usually have...? 'Usually' signals a habitual action — present simple tense.
