Explanations

1. “that day” (b)

In reported speech, 'today' shifts to 'that day'. The present simple 'have' becomes past simple 'had', and 'I' changes to 'she'.

2. “that day” (a)

In reported speech, 'today' becomes 'that day'. The present continuous 'am feeling' shifts to past continuous 'was feeling', and 'I' changes to 'he'.

3. “the day before” (c)

In reported speech, 'yesterday' changes to 'the day before' (or 'the previous day'). The past simple 'saw' shifts to past perfect 'had seen', and 'your' changes to 'my'.

4. “the previous day” (d)

In reported speech, 'yesterday' becomes 'the previous day' (or 'the day before'). The past simple 'arrived' shifts to past perfect 'had arrived', and 'we' changes to 'they'.

5. “the next day” (b)

In reported speech, 'tomorrow' changes to 'the next day' (or 'the following day'). The modal 'will' shifts to 'would', and pronouns change from 'I/you' to 'he/me'.

6. “the following day” (d)

In reported speech, 'tomorrow' becomes 'the following day' (or 'the next day'). The modal 'will' shifts to 'would'.

7. “then” (a)

In reported speech, 'now' changes to 'then' (or 'at that time'). The present simple 'am' shifts to past simple 'was', and 'I' becomes 'he'.

8. “at that time” (c)

In reported speech, 'now' becomes 'at that time' (or 'then'). The present continuous 'are leaving' shifts to past continuous 'were leaving', and 'we' changes to 'they'.

9. “there” (d)

In reported speech, 'here' changes to 'there' because the speaker is no longer in the same location. The present simple 'is' shifts to past simple 'was'.

10. “there” (b)

In reported speech, 'here' becomes 'there'. The present perfect 'have lived' shifts to past perfect 'had lived', and 'I' changes to 'he'.

11. “that” (c)

In reported speech, the demonstrative 'this' changes to 'that'. The past simple 'bought' shifts to past perfect 'had bought', and 'I' becomes 'he'.

12. “those” (a)

In reported speech, the demonstrative 'these' changes to 'those'. The past simple 'made' shifts to past perfect 'had made', and 'I/myself' change to 'she/herself'.

13. “before” (d)

In reported speech, 'ago' changes to 'before' (or 'earlier'). The past simple 'moved' shifts to past perfect 'had moved', and 'here' becomes 'there'.

14. “earlier” (b)

In reported speech, 'ago' becomes 'earlier' (or 'before'). The past simple 'left' shifts to past perfect 'had left'.

15. “the week before” (c)

In reported speech, 'last week' changes to 'the week before' (or 'the previous week'). The past simple 'started' shifts to past perfect 'had started', and 'my' becomes 'her'.

16. “the previous month” (a)

In reported speech, 'last month' becomes 'the previous month' (or 'the month before'). The past simple 'visited' shifts to past perfect 'had visited', and 'we' changes to 'they'.

17. “the following week” (d)

In reported speech, 'next week' changes to 'the following week'. The modal 'will' shifts to 'would', and 'my' becomes 'her'.

18. “the following month” (b)

In reported speech, 'next month' becomes 'the following month'. The modal 'will' shifts to 'would'.

19. “that night” (a)

In reported speech, 'tonight' changes to 'that night'. The present continuous 'am cooking' shifts to past continuous 'was cooking', and 'I' becomes 'she'.

20. “that night” (c)

In reported speech, 'tonight' becomes 'that night'. The modal 'will' shifts to 'would', and 'we' changes to 'they'.
