Explanations

1. “will be watching” (a)

Future Continuous 'will be watching' shows the action in progress at 9 pm.

2. “will call” (b)

Future Simple 'will call' is used for promises and spontaneous decisions.

3. “will be lying” (c)

'This time next week' requires Future Continuous for an ongoing action.

4. “will rain” (d)

Future Simple is used for predictions with 'I think'.

5. “will be having” (a)

At 8, dinner will be in progress, so use Future Continuous.

6. “will get” (b)

Future Simple is used for spontaneous decisions made at the moment.

7. “will be waiting” (c)

The waiting will be in progress when the arrival happens.

8. “will pass” (d)

Future Simple for predictions about results or achievements.

9. “will be celebrating” (a)

At midnight, celebrating will be in progress — Future Continuous.

10. “will let” (b)

Future Simple for promises.

11. “will be taking” (c)

'This time tomorrow' signals ongoing action — Future Continuous.

12. “will finish” (d)

Future Simple for completing an action by a deadline.

13. “will be building” (a)

The building work will be ongoing next month.

14. “will help” (b)

Future Simple for offers.

15. “will be seeing” (c)

At 3 pm, patient consultations will be in progress.

16. “will be” (d)

Future Simple for reassuring predictions.

17. “will be preparing” (a)

In an hour, preparation will be in progress.

18. “won't come” (b)

Future Simple 'won't come' is used for sudden decisions made at the moment of speaking. Future Continuous would describe an action in progress, not a spontaneous decision.

19. “will be guiding” (c)

'As the plane is touching down' emphasizes simultaneous, ongoing action. 'Will be guiding' (Future Continuous) describes the in-progress action happening at the same time.

20. “will do” (d)

Future Simple 'will do' is used for predictions about a permanent outcome or result. The focus is on the end state (robots replacing humans), not an action in progress at a specific time.
