# Explanations

**1. “will have been working” (a)**

Use 'will have been working' to describe an action that will continue up to a specific future point, emphasizing duration.

**2. “will have been studying” (b)**

Future Perfect Continuous ('will have been studying') shows an ongoing action with duration leading up to a future event.

**3. “will have been driving” (c)**

Use 'will have been driving' to emphasize the continuous duration of the action up to the specified future time.

**4. “will have been living” (d)**

Future Perfect Continuous emphasizes the ongoing nature and duration of living in the house up to next summer.

**5. “will have been exercising” (a)**

Use 'will have been exercising' to show a continuous action with duration up to the future arrival time.

**6. “will have been playing” (b)**

Future Perfect Continuous describes the continuous duration of playing piano up to the end of this year.

**7. “will have been working” (c)**

Use 'will have been working' to emphasize the ongoing effort and duration up to the future deadline.

**8. “will have been waiting” (d)**

Future Perfect Continuous shows the duration of waiting up to when the bus arrives.

**9. “will have been raining” (a)**

Use 'will have been raining' to describe continuous rainfall with duration up to tomorrow morning.

**10. “will have been performing” (b)**

Future Perfect Continuous shows the continuous activity of performing together over the years.

**11. “won't have been working” (c)**

Negative Future Perfect Continuous: 'won't have been + verb-ing' shows the action will not have been happening for long.

**12. “won't have been waiting” (d)**

Use 'won't have been waiting' to express that the duration of waiting will be short.

**13. “won't have been living” (a)**

Negative Future Perfect Continuous indicates insufficient duration of living there.

**14. “won't have been working” (b)**

'Won't have been working' (negative Future Perfect Continuous) with 'by the time' expresses that no continuous work will have occurred up to the party, explaining the available energy.

**15. “won't have been practicing” (c)**

Negative Future Perfect Continuous shows the practice period will be short.

**16. “won't have been hiking” (d)**

'Won't have been hiking' indicates a short duration, explaining why exhaustion won't be severe.

**17. “won't have been running” (a)**

'Won't have been running' (negative Future Perfect Continuous) with 'by the time' expresses that the machine will not have been running continuously up to that future check, so overheating is unlikely.

**18. “won't have been working” (b)**

'Won't have been working' shows insufficient duration for qualification.

**19. “won't have been staying” (c)**

Negative Future Perfect Continuous emphasizes the short duration of stay.

**20. “won't have been training” (d)**

'Won't have been training' shows the training period will be brief before competition.
