Explanations

1. “Will ... have been waiting” (a)

Form questions in Future Perfect Continuous with 'Will + subject + have been + verb-ing'.

2. “she will” (b)

Short answer to Future Perfect Continuous questions: 'Yes, + subject + will' or 'No, + subject + won't'.

3. “Will” (c)

Questions in Future Perfect Continuous start with 'Will' followed by subject + have been + verb-ing.

4. “he won't” (d)

Negative short answer uses 'won't': 'No, he won't.'

5. “will” (a)

Wh-questions in Future Perfect Continuous: 'How long + will + subject + have been + verb-ing'.

6. “won't” (b)

Negative statement with Future Perfect Continuous uses 'won't have been + verb-ing'.

7. “Will” (c)

Yes/No questions start with 'Will' in Future Perfect Continuous.

8. “a few minutes” (d)

This response provides specific duration information rather than just a short answer.

9. “will” (a)

Future Perfect Continuous affirmative uses 'will have been + verb-ing'.

10. “will” (b)

Wh-questions follow the pattern: Wh-word + will + subject + have been + verb-ing.

11. “won't have” (c)

With the future time marker 'by next month', only 'won't have' fits to form the negative Future Perfect Continuous: 'won't have been living'.

12. “they will” (d)

Short answer to Future Perfect Continuous: 'Yes, they will.'

13. “How” (a)

'How long' is used to ask about duration in Future Perfect Continuous questions.

14. “will” (b)

Use 'will' to form Future Perfect Continuous: 'will have been driving'.

15. “you won't” (c)

Negative reassurance uses 'you won't' for Future Perfect Continuous.

16. “won't” (d)

Negative Future Perfect Continuous uses 'won't have been + verb-ing'.

17. “Where” (a)

'Where' is the correct wh-word to ask about location. 'How will they have been staying' is unnatural, 'When' and 'What' don't fit the context of asking about a place.

18. “Will” (b)

Yes/No questions in Future Perfect Continuous begin with 'Will'.

19. “they won't” (c)

Negative short answer: 'No, they won't.'

20. “won't” (d)

Negative Future Perfect Continuous explains why she won't be fit.
