# Explanations

**1. “will call” (c)**

Future Simple ('will call') is used for simple future plans and promises.

**2. “will be relaxing” (b)**

Future Continuous ('will be relaxing') describes an action in progress at a specific future moment.

**3. “will have finished” (c)**

Future Perfect ('will have finished') shows completion before a future point.

**4. “will have been working” (d)**

Future Perfect Continuous ('will have been working') emphasizes duration up to a future point.

**5. “will be having” (b)**

Future Continuous indicates the activity in progress at 8 PM.

**6. “will study” (d)**

Future Simple is used for promises and commitments.

**7. “will have left” (c)**

Future Perfect shows the action will be complete before the reading happens.

**8. “will be taking” (b)**

Future Continuous describes the exam in progress at 3 PM.

**9. “will rain” (a)**

Future Simple ('will rain') is used for spontaneous predictions. 'Is raining' refers to now, not a future prediction. The perfect forms are too complex for a simple prediction.

**10. “will have been raining” (d)**

Future Perfect Continuous emphasizes the duration of the rain.

**11. “will be” (c)**

Future Simple states the fact about her age next month.

**12. “will be waiting” (b)**

Future Continuous ('will be waiting') shows the waiting will be in progress at the moment of arrival. 'Waited' is past tense and incorrect for a future context.

**13. “will have found” (c)**

Future Perfect expresses hope that the cure will be complete by 2030.

**14. “will have been searching” (d)**

Future Perfect Continuous emphasizes the ongoing research over decades.

**15. “will leave” (a)**

Future Simple can be used for scheduled events (though Present Simple is also common).

**16. “will be living” (b)**

Future Continuous describes the ongoing situation at that future time.

**17. “will pay” (a)**

Future Simple is used for promises.

**18. “will have been sitting” (d)**

Future Perfect Continuous emphasizes the duration of sitting.

**19. “will text” (a)**

Future Simple is used for immediate actions after another event.

**20. “will have served” (c)**

Future Perfect emphasizes the completed count of customers served.
