Explanations

1. “will have passed” (c)

Use 'will have + past participle' (will have passed) to describe an action completed before a future time ('by next month').

2. “will have finished” (a)

Future Perfect 'will have finished' shows the report will be complete before Friday arrives.

3. “will have eaten” (d)

'Will have eaten' indicates dinner will be finished before your arrival.

4. “will have completed” (b)

Use Future Perfect 'will have completed' for actions finished before a deadline.

5. “will have found” (c)

'Will have found' expresses that the discovery will happen before 2030.

6. “will have written” (a)

Future Perfect 'will have written' shows all three books will be complete before year-end.

7. “will have lived” (b)

'Will have lived' describes a duration that will be complete by next summer.

8. “will have left” (d)

'Will have left' means the train's departure will happen before we arrive.

9. “will have melted” (a)

Use 'will have melted' to show the snow will be gone before tomorrow morning.

10. “will have made” (c)

'Will have made' indicates all arrangements will be complete before Monday.

11. “will have prepared” (b)

Future Perfect 'will have prepared' shows the presentation will be ready before the boss comes.

12. “will have graduated” (d)

'Will have graduated' means her graduation will be complete before June.

13. “will have moved” (a)

'Will have moved' shows the move will be finished before this time next year.

14. “will have built” (b)

Use 'will have built' to show the construction will be complete before December.

15. “will have saved” (c)

'Will have saved' means the saving goal will be reached before next year.

16. “will have gone” (d)

'Will have gone' (irregular: go → gone) shows all guests will leave before midnight.

17. “will have hired” (a)

Future Perfect 'will have hired' indicates the hiring will be complete before next quarter.

18. “will have learned” (b)

'Will have learned' shows the learning will be complete by the course end.

19. “will have run” (c)

'Will have run' (irregular: run → run) means she will complete three marathons before next month.

20. “will have found” (d)

'Will have found' indicates the solution will be discovered before Friday.
