Explanations

1. “will” (a)

Use 'will' for a spontaneous offer to help. The speaker sees someone struggling and decides to help right now.

2. “will” (b)

Use 'will' before the base form of the verb 'be' to express future.

3. “will” (c)

Use 'will' + base verb for future actions. 'Will' is the same for all subjects.

4. “will” (d)

Use 'will' to express future plans or arrangements.

5. “will” (a)

Use 'will' + base verb to talk about future events.

6. “will” (b)

Use 'will not' (or won't) to form negative future sentences. Here 'will' comes before 'not'.

7. “won't” (c)

Use 'won't' (will not) to express negative future. It means he is not coming.

8. “won't” (d)

Use 'won't' to promise or assure that something negative will not happen.

9. “won't” (a)

Use 'won't' (will not) to make a promise about not doing something in the future.

10. “won't” (b)

Use 'won't' to say that something will not happen in the future.

11. “will” (c)

Use 'will' + base verb to express future actions.

12. “will” (a)

Use 'will' to make predictions about the future.

13. “will” (b)

Use 'will' + 'be' to talk about future states or ages.

14. “will” (d)

Use 'will' to reassure someone about the future.

15. “won't” (a)

Use 'won't' to say something will not happen. 'Don't' is for present simple.

16. “won't” (c)

Use 'won't' when making a promise not to do something.

17. “will” (c)

Use 'will' to express what will happen as a result.

18. “won't” (b)

Use 'won't' to predict a negative outcome in the future.

19. “will” (b)

Use 'will' to talk about future events at a specific time.

20. “won't” (d)

Use 'won't' to express refusal of a specific offer. The speaker is declining a particular dish being offered right now.
