Explanations

1. “are going to” (a)

Use 'be going to' for pre-planned actions. The tickets are already booked.

2. “is going to” (b)

The saving indicates a prior decision/plan, so use 'be going to'.

3. “am going to” (c)

Use 'be going to' when you've already made a decision (before speaking).

4. “are going to” (d)

The plan is already made — they've found the house.

5. “is going to” (a)

Prior preparation shows a pre-planned intention.

6. “are going to” (b)

Buying paint shows prior planning for redecorating.

7. “am going to” (c)

Already spoken to the boss = arrangement made before now.

8. “is going to” (a)

Research indicates a planned intention.

9. “am going to” (d)

Invitations sent = party is already planned.

10. “are going to” (a)

Hiring movers shows a definite plan to move.

11. “is going to” (b)

Long-term preparation indicates a planned intention.

12. “am going to” (c)

Already signed up = decision was made before now.

13. “are going to” (a)

Prior discussion and decision = use 'be going to'.

14. “is going to” (b)

Packed bags show prior planning to leave.

15. “am going to” (d)

Careful thought before speaking = pre-made decision.

16. “are going to” (a)

Months of planning = definite intention.

17. “is going to” (b)

Buying ingredients shows the plan was already made.

18. “am going to” (c)

Setting the alarm = prior planning for the run.

19. “are going to” (a)

Colors already chosen = plan made before speaking.

20. “is going to” (b)

Resignation submitted = definite planned intention.
