Explanations

1. “wasn't sleeping” (c)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'I' to form the negative.

2. “wasn't listening” (a)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'she' to form the negative.

3. “weren't working” (a)

Use 'weren't' + -ing with 'they' to form the negative.

4. “wasn't paying” (a)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'he' to form the negative.

5. “weren't waiting” (b)

Use 'weren't' + -ing with 'we' to form the negative.

6. “wasn't raining” (c)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'it' to form the negative.

7. “weren't driving” (c)

Use 'weren't' + -ing with 'you' to form the negative.

8. “weren't behaving” (a)

Use 'weren't' + -ing with plural subjects like 'the children' (= they).

9. “wasn't working” (d)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'my phone' (= it).

10. “weren't studying” (d)

Use 'weren't' + -ing with 'the students' (= they).

11. “wasn't joking” (d)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'I' to form the negative.

12. “wasn't barking” (b)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'the dog' (= it).

13. “weren't arguing” (c)

Use 'weren't' + -ing with 'my parents' (= they).

14. “wasn't wearing” (c)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'she' to form the negative.

15. “wasn't shining” (b)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'the sun' (= it).

16. “weren't dancing” (d)

Use 'weren't' + -ing with compound subjects like 'Tom and Sarah' (= they).

17. “wasn't crying” (c)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'the baby' (= it).

18. “wasn't lying” (a)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'I'. Note: lie → lying (drop the 'ie', add 'y' + ing).

19. “weren't expecting” (c)

Use 'weren't' + -ing with 'they' to form the negative.

20. “wasn't trying” (c)

Use 'wasn't' + -ing with 'he'. Note: try → trying.
