# Explanations

**1. “walked” (a)**

Most regular verbs: add -ed. walk → walked

**2. “worked” (d)**

Add -ed to the base form. work → worked

**3. “played” (a)**

For verbs ending in vowel + y, just add -ed. play → played

**4. “lived” (d)**

For verbs ending in -e, just add -d. live → lived

**5. “studied” (b)**

For verbs ending in consonant + y, change y to i and add -ed. study → studied

**6. “cried” (c)**

Consonant + y: change y to i, add -ed. cry → cried

**7. “stopped” (d)**

For short verbs (CVC pattern), double the final consonant and add -ed. stop → stopped

**8. “planned” (c)**

CVC pattern: double the final consonant. plan → planned

**9. “visited” (c)**

Two-syllable verbs with stress on first syllable: just add -ed. visit → visited

**10. “enjoyed” (a)**

Vowel + y: just add -ed. enjoy → enjoyed

**11. “preferred” (b)**

Two-syllable verbs with stress on final syllable: double the consonant. prefer → preferred

**12. “explained” (b)**

Regular verb: add -ed. explain → explained

**13. “tried” (c)**

Consonant + y: change y to i, add -ed. try → tried

**14. “danced” (c)**

Verbs ending in -e: just add -d. dance → danced

**15. “traveled” (d)**

American English: traveled. British English: travelled. Both are correct.

**16. “watched” (a)**

Regular verb: add -ed. watch → watched

**17. “dropped” (b)**

CVC pattern: double the final consonant. drop → dropped

**18. “played” (a)**

Vowel + y: just add -ed. play → played

**19. “arrived” (b)**

Verbs ending in -e: just add -d. arrive → arrived

**20. “married” (d)**

Consonant + y: change y to i, add -ed. marry → married
