Explanations

1. “have visited, was” (c)

Present Perfect for life experience (no specific time). Past Simple for a specific time (in 2019).

2. “hasn't finished” (d)

'Yet' signals Present Perfect — the action is not complete but may happen.

3. “moved” (b)

'Last year' is a finished time → use Past Simple.

4. “have just finished” (d)

'Just' with Present Perfect for very recent completion with relevance to now.

5. “wrote” (d)

Shakespeare is dead → finished time period → Past Simple.

6. “have known” (c)

'Since' + past point signals Present Perfect — the knowing continues to now.

7. “did, go” (c)

'Last summer' is a finished time → Past Simple question.

8. “Have, tried” (b)

'Ever' asks about life experience → Present Perfect.

9. “have lost” (a)

Present Perfect because the result matters now (keys are still missing).

10. “was, saw” (b)

'The last time' refers to a specific occasion → Past Simple.

11. “has worked” (a)

'For + period + now' signals Present Perfect — she still works here.

12. “saw, was” (a)

'Yesterday' is a finished time → Past Simple for both verbs.

13. “have ever read” (a)

Superlative + Present Perfect for the best/worst experience in your life so far.

14. “died” (b)

Specific past time (in 1995) → Past Simple.

15. “haven't eaten” (c)

'Today' is not finished → Present Perfect. The result affects now (hungry).

16. “did, graduate” (d)

'Ago' is used with Past Simple for a specific time in the past.

17. “has changed” (a)

'In recent years' connects past to present → Present Perfect.

18. “have already seen” (d)

'Already' with Present Perfect for something completed before expected.

19. “lived” (d)

'When she was a student' is a finished period → Past Simple.

20. “have been” (d)

'For + period' with ongoing friendship → Present Perfect. We are still friends.
