Explanations

1. “are” (a)

Wh- question structure: What + are + you + doing. Use 'are' with 'you'.

2. “is” (d)

Wh- question structure: Where + is + she + going. Use 'is' with he/she/it.

3. “are” (a)

Wh- question structure: Why + are + they + laughing. Use 'are' with they/we/you.

4. “is” (a)

When 'who' is the subject, use 'is' (singular) by default: Who is talking?

5. “are” (a)

Use 'are' because 'the children' is plural.

6. “are” (d)

Use 'are' with 'we'.

7. “are” (a)

Use 'are' with 'you'. 'How are you feeling?' asks about current state.

8. “is” (b)

Use 'is' with 'what' when asking about a singular event or situation.

9. “is” (d)

Use 'is' with 'he'.

10. “am” (d)

Use 'am' with 'I'.

11. “Who” (c)

'Who' asks about a person. 'Who is she talking to?' = Which person?

12. “Where” (a)

'Where' asks about a place or location.

13. “Why” (b)

'Why' asks for a reason.

14. “What” (b)

'What' asks about a thing or action.

15. “How” (b)

'How' asks about the manner or method.

16. “is” (a)

Use 'is' because 'the movie' is third person singular.

17. “are” (b)

Use 'are' because 'people' is plural.

18. “What” (b)

'What' asks about a thing or unknown source. 'Why' cannot be used as the subject of a sentence.

19. “are” (a)

Use 'are' with 'you'. 'Which' asks about a specific choice.

20. “are” (c)

Use 'are' with 'they'. 'How long' asks about duration.
