Explanations

1. “am meeting” (c)

Use Present Continuous for a fixed arrangement. The time (3pm) shows it's already arranged.

2. “is flying” (a)

Use Present Continuous for arranged travel plans. The booking confirms the arrangement.

3. “are getting” (a)

Use Present Continuous for fixed future events like weddings.

4. “are ... doing” (d)

Use Present Continuous to ask about someone's plans or arrangements.

5. “are moving” (d)

Use Present Continuous for planned future events like moving house.

6. “am seeing” (c)

Use Present Continuous for appointments that have been made.

7. “isn't coming” (d)

Use Present Continuous (negative) for arranged future events.

8. “are visiting” (b)

Use Present Continuous when someone has confirmed they'll come.

9. “am working” (a)

Use Present Continuous for arranged work schedules.

10. “are ... going” (b)

Use Present Continuous to ask about holiday plans.

11. “leaves” (a)

Use Present Simple (not Continuous) for timetables and schedules.

12. “are having” (c)

Use Present Continuous for arranged social events.

13. “is taking” (d)

Use Present Continuous for scheduled appointments and tests.

14. “will rain” (c)

Use 'will' (not Present Continuous) for predictions, not arrangements.

15. “are having” (a)

Use Present Continuous for arranged dinners with specific people and times.

16. “starts” (a)

Use Present Simple for fixed schedules (cinemas, buses, etc.).

17. “am meeting” (c)

Use Present Continuous when the arrangement has already been made.

18. “Are ... doing” (d)

Use Present Continuous to ask about evening plans.

19. “are having” (a)

Use Present Continuous for expected future events like having a baby.

20. “am visiting” (b)

Use Present Continuous for arranged visits.
