3. “Have” (a)

Use 'Have' to form questions with 'you'.

4. “Has” (c)

Use 'Has' to form questions with 'he'.

5. “haven't” (b)

Use 'haven't' for negative sentences with 'they'.

6. “Has” (c)

Use 'Has' to form questions with 'your sister' (= she).

7. “haven't” (b)

Use 'haven't' for negative sentences with 'we'.

8. “Have” (c)

Use 'Have' to form questions with 'the children' (= they, plural).

9. “hasn't” (d)

Use 'hasn't' for negative sentences with 'the package' (= it).

10. “Have, have” (b)

Use 'Have' for questions with 'you', and 'have' for the short answer.
