# Explanations

**1. “for” (b)**

**2. “since” (d)**

'2015' is a point in time (when she started), so use 'since'.

**3. “for” (d)**

'A long time' is a duration, so use 'for'.

'Last summer' is a point in time, so use 'since'.

**5. “since” (d)**

'They were children' refers to a point in time (when they met), so use 'since'.

'Two hours' is a duration, so use 'for'.
