Explanations

1. “am” (b)

Use 'am' with I. I am a student.

2. “is” (c)

Use 'is' with she. She is my sister.

3. “are” (a)

Use 'are' with they. They are in the park.

4. “is” (d)

Use 'is' with he. He is ten years old.

5. “are” (b)

Use 'are' with we. We are happy today.

6. “is” (a)

The dog is 'it'. Use 'is'. The dog is big.

7. “am” (b)

Use 'am' with I. I am from Japan.

8. “are” (c)

Tom and I = we. Use 'are'. We are friends.

9. “is” (d)

Mum is 'she'. Use 'is'. My mum is a teacher.

10. “are” (c)

Use 'are' with you. You are very tall.

11. “is” (a)

Use 'is' with it. It is cold outside.

12. “am” (c)

Use 'am' with I. I am not tired.

13. “is” (b)

Use 'is' with she. She is not at home.

14. “are” (d)

Use 'are' with they. They are not sad.

15. “is” (d)

Use 'is' with he. He is not my brother.

16. “has” (d)

'Has' is correct — she owns a cat. 'Is' would mean she IS a cat!

17. “play” (c)

'Play' is the right verb. They play football. 'Are' doesn't work here.

18. “drinks” (b)

'Drinks' is correct. He drinks milk. We need an action verb, not 'be'.

19. “are” (c)

The children = they. Use 'are'. The children are in the classroom.

20. “am” (a)

Use 'am' with I. I am hungry.
