Use 'Do' with you. Do you like ice cream?

2. “Does” (c)

Use 'Does' with she. Does she speak English?

3. “Do” (a)

Use 'Do' with they. Do they play football?

4. “Does” (b)

Use 'Does' with he. Does he live near the school?

5. “Do” (c)

Use 'Do' with you. Do you have a pet?

6. “Does” (a)

Your mum is 'she'. Use 'Does'. Does your mum cook dinner?

7. “Do” (b)

Use 'Do' with we. Do we need a pencil?

8. “Does” (d)

The cat is 'it'. Use 'Does'. Does the cat sleep on the bed?

9. “Do” (a)

Use 'Do' with you. Do you walk to school?

10. “Does” (d)

Tom is 'he'. Use 'Does'. Does Tom eat lunch at school?
