# Explanations

**1. “is” (a)**

She IS a doctor — this describes who she is. Use 'is'.

**2. “play” (d)**

Football is an action. Use 'play' with they. They play football.

**3. “am” (b)**

Happy is a feeling, not an action. Use 'am' with I. I am happy.

**4. “goes” (c)**

'Goes' is an action — he travels by bus. Use 'goes' with he.

**5. “live” (a)**

'Live' is the action verb. We live in a big house.

**6. “is” (c)**

The book IS on the table — this tells us where it is. Use 'is'.

**7. “speaks” (b)**

'Speaks' is an action. My sister speaks English and French.

**8. “are” (b)**

Kind is an adjective — it describes you. Use 'are' with you.

**9. “eats” (d)**

'Eats' is an action. She eats rice for lunch.

**10. “are” (c)**

This tells us WHERE the children are — a location. Use 'are'.

**11. “is” (a)**

Tall describes how he looks. Use 'is' with he. He is very tall.

**12. “drink” (b)**

'Drink' is an action. I drink milk every morning.

**13. “is” (d)**

This tells us WHERE Tom is from — his origin. Use 'is'. Tom is from Canada.

**14. “makes” (c)**

'Makes' is an action. My mum makes breakfast at seven.

**15. “are” (a)**

This describes a relationship. Use 'are'. They are good friends.

**16. “reads” (d)**

'Reads' is an action. She reads books before bed.

**17. “is” (b)**

This tells us WHERE the cat is — a location. Use 'is'. The cat is under the bed.

**18. “learn” (d)**

'Learn' is an action. We learn English at school.

**19. “is” (c)**

Funny describes my dad. Use 'is'. My dad is very funny.

**20. “listen to” (a)**

'Listen to' is an action. You listen to music every day.
