Explanations

1. “since” (b)

'Since' is used with a point in time (when I was ten years old).

2. “ever” (a)

'Ever' is used in questions about life experiences.

3. “still” (c)

'Still' with negatives shows surprise or impatience that something continues.

4. “until” (c)

'Until' means wait up to the point when I return.

5. “for” (b)

'For' is used with a duration (twenty years).

6. “already” (d)

'Already' indicates the task is completed.

7. “While” (c)

'While' shows two events happening at the same time.

8. “never” (c)

'Never' indicates she has not visited at any time.

9. “as soon as” (d)

'As soon as' means immediately when the results come.

10. “yet” (c)

'Yet' is used at the end of questions about expected events.

11. “just” (b)

'Just' means something happened moments ago. 'Ten seconds ago' confirms the very recent timing.

12. “from” (a)

'From...to' shows a range with start and end points (days of the week).

13. “Before” (c)

'Before' indicates turning off lights should happen first.

14. “ever” (c)

'Ever' with superlatives emphasizes the extreme quality.

15. “still” (d)

'Still' indicates a surprising continuing situation.

16. “since” (b)

'Since' is used with a point in time (last summer).

17. “when” (d)

'When' introduces the moment the phone interrupted.

18. “already” (c)

'Already' indicates the decision has been made.

'Until' means staying will continue up to that point.
