Explanations

1. “seen” (d)

After 'have/has' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'see' is 'seen' (not 'saw', which is the past simple). See → saw → seen.

2. “been” (b)

After 'has' (present perfect), use the past participle. 'Has been to' means she visited and came back. The past participle of 'be' is 'been'. Be → was/were → been.

3. “eaten” (a)

After 'have' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'eat' is 'eaten' (not 'ate', which is the past simple). Eat → ate → eaten.

4. “lost” (d)

After 'has' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'lose' is 'lost'. Lose → lost → lost (V2 and V3 are the same).

5. “written” (c)

After 'have' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'write' is 'written' (not 'wrote', which is the past simple). Write → wrote → written.

6. “slept” (a)

After 'has' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'sleep' is 'slept' (not *sleped). Sleep → slept → slept.

7. “driven” (b)

After 'have never' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'drive' is 'driven' (not 'drove', which is the past simple). Drive → drove → driven.

8. “spoken” (c)

After 'has' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'speak' is 'spoken' (not 'spoke', which is the past simple). Speak → spoke → spoken.

9. “taken” (d)

After 'Have you' (present perfect question), use the past participle. The past participle of 'take' is 'taken' (not 'took', which is the past simple). Take → took → taken.

10. “spent” (a)

After 'has' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'spend' is 'spent' (not *spended). Spend → spent → spent.

11. “sung” (b)

After 'have' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'sing' is 'sung' (not 'sang', which is the past simple). Sing → sang → sung.

12. “drunk” (d)

After 'have' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'drink' is 'drunk' (not 'drank', which is the past simple). Drink → drank → drunk.

13. “brought” (c)

After 'have' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'bring' is 'brought' (not *bringed). Bring → brought → brought.

14. “made” (b)

After 'had' (past perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'make' is 'made'. Make → made → made (V2 and V3 are the same).

15. “come” (a)

After 'have' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'come' is 'come' (same as the base form, but different from the past simple 'came'). Come → came → come.

16. “set” (c)

After 'has' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'set' is 'set' — the form never changes. Set → set → set.

17. “thought” (d)

After 'have' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'think' is 'thought' (not *thinked). Think → thought → thought.

18. “found” (b)

After 'Has anyone' (present perfect question), use the past participle. The past participle of 'find' is 'found' (not *finded). Find → found → found.

19. “flown” (a)

After 'have never' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'fly' is 'flown' (not 'flew', which is the past simple). Fly → flew → flown.

20. “told” (c)

After 'has' (present perfect), use the past participle. The past participle of 'tell' is 'told'. Tell → told → told (V2 and V3 are the same).
