# Explanations

**1. “Do” (a)**

Use 'Do' to form questions with you. Do you speak English?

**2. “Does” (c)**

Use 'Does' with he/she/it to form present simple questions. Does she live near the school?

**3. “do” (d)**

Use 'do' with they in wh-questions. What do they usually eat for breakfast?

**4. “does” (b)**

'Your father' = he (singular), so use 'does'. Where does your father work?

**5. “Do” (c)**

'The children' is plural (= they), so use 'Do'. Do the children like ice cream?

**6. “does” (a)**

Use 'does' with he in wh-questions. How often does he go to the gym?

**7. “Do” (d)**

Use 'Do' with you to ask questions. Do you have any brothers or sisters?

**8. “does” (c)**

'The film' is singular (= it), so use 'does'. What time does the film start?

**9. “Does” (a)**

'Your mother' = she (singular), so use 'Does'. Does your mother work in a hospital?

**10. “do” (d)**

Answer a 'Do you...?' question with 'Yes, I do.' The short answer mirrors the auxiliary verb.

**11. “doesn't” (b)**

Answer a 'Does he...?' question with 'No, he doesn't.' Match the auxiliary: does → doesn't.

**12. “Does” (b)**

'It' is singular, so use 'Does'. Does it rain a lot in your city?

**13. “do” (a)**

Use 'do' with you in wh-questions. How do you get to school every day?

**14. “Do” (d)**

'Your friends' is plural (= they), so use 'Do'. Do your friends enjoy cooking?

**15. “does” (c)**

Answer a 'Does she...?' question with 'Yes, she does.' Don't repeat the main verb in a short answer.

**16. “does” (b)**

'This word' is singular (= it), so use 'does'. What does this word mean?

**17. “Do” (a)**

'You and your sister' is plural, so use 'Do'. Do you and your sister go to the same school?

**18. “does” (b)**

Use 'does' with she in wh-questions. Why does she always arrive late?

**19. “don't” (c)**

Answer a 'Do they...?' question with 'No, they don't.' Match the auxiliary: do → don't.

**20. “Does” (d)**

'Mr Wilson' is singular (= he), so use 'Does'. Does Mr Wilson teach at your school?
