Explanations

1. “don't” (a)

Use 'don't' with I. I don't like spicy food.

2. “doesn't” (b)

Use 'doesn't' with she. She doesn't want to go to the party.

3. “don't” (c)

Use 'don't' with we. We don't have a car.

4. “doesn't” (d)

Use 'doesn't' with he. He doesn't know the answer.

5. “don't” (d)

'My parents' is plural (= they), so use 'don't'. My parents don't live in this city.

6. “doesn't” (a)

'The cat' is singular (= it), so use 'doesn't'. The cat doesn't eat vegetables.

7. “don't” (b)

Use 'don't' with you. You don't need to bring anything.

8. “doesn't” (c)

Use 'doesn't' with it. It doesn't snow very often here.

9. “don't” (a)

'Tom and Lisa' is plural (= they), so use 'don't'. Tom and Lisa don't agree with each other.

10. “doesn't” (d)

Use 'doesn't' with she. She doesn't understand the question.
