Explanations

1. “have” (a)

Use 'have' with I/you/we/they. I have a big family.

2. “has” (b)

Use 'has' with he/she/it (third-person singular). She has long brown hair.

3. “have” (c)

Use 'have' with we. We have a new teacher this year.

4. “has” (d)

Use 'has' with singular subjects. 'The house' = it, so we say: The house has a large garden.

5. “have” (a)

'My parents' is plural (= they), so use 'have'. My parents have a car.

6. “has” (b)

Tom is a singular subject (= he), so use 'has'. Tom has two sisters.

7. “have” (c)

Use 'have' with 'you' — both singular and plural 'you' take 'have'. You have a very nice smile.

8. “don't have” (d)

Use 'don't have' with I/you/we/they in negative sentences. I don't have any money with me.

9. “doesn't have” (a)

Use 'doesn't have' with he/she/it in negative sentences. He doesn't have a computer at home.

10. “don't have” (b)

Use 'don't have' with we. We don't have enough time to finish.

11. “doesn't have” (c)

'The school' is singular (= it), so use 'doesn't have'. The school doesn't have a swimming pool.

12. “don't have” (d)

Use 'don't have' with they. They don't have any pets.

13. “doesn't have” (a)

Use 'doesn't have' with she. She doesn't have a lot of free time. Note: 'isn't have' is never correct.

14. “Do” (b)

Use 'Do + subject + have' to form questions with I/you/we/they. Do you have a pen I can borrow?

15. “Does” (c)

Use 'Does + subject + have' to form questions with he/she/it. Does she have any brothers or sisters?

16. “does” (d)

'The hotel' is singular (= it), so use 'does'. How many rooms does the hotel have?

17. “Do” (a)

'Your children' is plural (= they), so use 'Do'. Do your children have their own bedrooms?

18. “doesn't” (b)

Short answer with 'Does' → 'No, he doesn't.' The full form is 'No, he doesn't have a driving licence.'

19. “do” (c)

Short answer with 'Do' → 'Yes, I do.' We don't say 'Yes, I have' when the question uses 'Do you have...?'

20. “Does” (d)

'The flat' is singular (= it), so use 'Does'. Does the flat have a balcony?
