Explanations

1. “Have” (a)

Use 'Have + subject + got' to form questions with I/you/we/they. Have you got a dictionary?

2. “Has” (b)

Use 'Has + subject + got' to form questions with he/she/it. Has she got any pets?

3. “Have” (c)

'Your parents' is plural (= they), so use 'Have'. Have your parents got a garden?

4. “Has” (d)

'The hotel' is singular (= it), so use 'Has'. Has the hotel got a swimming pool?

5. “Has” (a)

Tom is singular (= he), so use 'Has'. Has Tom got a new job?

6. “has” (b)

'The house' is singular (= it), so use 'has'. How many rooms has the house got?

7. “Have” (c)

Use 'Have' with we. Have we got enough food for the party?

8. “has” (d)

Use 'has' with he. What kind of car has he got?

9. “Have” (a)

'The children' is plural (= they), so use 'Have'. Have the children got their coats?

10. “have” (b)

Use 'have' with you. How much money have you got?

11. “have” (c)

Short answer to 'Have you got...?' → 'Yes, I have.' (NOT 'Yes, I have got.' or 'Yes, I do.')

12. “hasn't” (d)

Short answer to 'Has he got...?' → 'No, he hasn't.' Use 'hasn't' for he/she/it.

13. “have” (a)

Short answer to 'Have they got...?' → 'Yes, they have.'

14. “hasn't” (b)

Short answer to 'Has it got...?' → 'No, it hasn't.'

15. “haven't” (c)

Short answer to 'Have they got...?' → 'No, they haven't.'

16. “has” (d)

Short answer to 'Has she got...?' → 'Yes, she has.'

17. “haven't” (a)

Short answer to 'Have you got...?' → 'No, I haven't.'

18. “has” (b)

Short answer to 'Has it got...?' → 'Yes, it has.'

19. “haven't” (c)

Short answer to 'Have we got...?' → 'No, we haven't.'

20. “has” (d)

Short answer to 'Has she got...?' → 'Yes, she has.'
